## ORDER:

On January 28, 2022, the Court issued an order holding in abeyance Appellants' "Time Sensitive Motion for a Stay Pending Appeal" pending the Supreme Court's resolution of Appellant's request for a stay in *Merrill v. Milligan*, 21A375 (21-1086).

Appellants then filed a stay application and a petition for a writ of certiorari before judgment with the Supreme Court for this case. *See Merrill v. Caster*, No. 21A376 (21-1087).

On February 7, 2022, the Supreme Court issued an order which, among other things, granted Appellants' petition for a writ of certiorari before judgment in *Caster* and stayed the

preliminary injunction orders at issue in *Milligan* and *Caster. See* Order, Nos. 21-1086 & 21-1087 (U.S. Feb. 7, 2022).

Accordingly, Appellants' "Time Sensitive Motion for a Stay Pending Appeal" and "Time Sensitive Motion to Expedite Briefing Schedule for Appellants' Time Sensitive Motion for Stay Pending Appeal" are DENIED AS MOOT.

Additionally, on February 10, 2022, Appellants filed an "Unopposed Motion to Place Appeal in Abeyance and Vacate All Deadlines." In light of the Supreme Court's February 7, 2022 order, that motion is GRANTED.
