DECLARATION OF JESSICA LOWE-MINOR

I, Jessica Lowe-Minor, swear under penalty of perjury that the following information is true to the best of my knowledge and state as follows:

1. I am a resident of Tallahassee, FL where I have lived for 25 years, since 2001. I am a lifelong Floridian and was born in Jacksonville, FL.
2. I have served as President of League of Women Voters of Florida (“LWVFL”) since June 2025 year. I first joined the League in 2010 and have served in various roles. From 2010 to 2014, I served as executive director for the LWVFL; from 2016 to 2018, I served as a director for the League of Women Voters of the United States; and from 2018 to 2022, I served as a treasurer for the League of Women Voters of the United States.
3. The League of Women Voters operates on a tri-federated structure. When someone joins the League of Women Voters of the United States, they are also plugged into their state chapter and the nearest local chapter based on their zip code. LWVFL is a 501(c)(4) registered non-profit.
4. As President of League of Women Voters of Florida, I facilitate and plan LWVFL’s board meetings and conventions, represent LWVFL to the media, the public, and government officials, set the LWVFL’s policies and goals, review all major LWVFL publications prior to print, and identify and recruit new members to the League.
5. I am authorized to speak for the League of Women Voters Florida in this case.
6. League of Women Voters of Florida has been dedicated to encouraging informed and active participation in government since it was founded in 1939. For decades the League has **played a central role in Florida’s redistricting efforts.**
7. League of Women Voters of Florida regularly works toward redistricting reform by engaging in public education, advocacy, and litigation in order to secure fair maps for all Floridians. This includes seeking to protect the interests of members to vote under lawful and constitutional voting plans that are not made without partisan intent or the denial of equal voting power.
8. League of Women Voters of Florida helped lead the successful passage of the Fair Districts Amendments in 2010 and League of Women Voters of Florida continues to work to defend and enforce those protections today.
9. Prior to the passage of the Fair Districts Amendments, LWVFL helped shaped the amendment language that would appear on the ballot and collected signatures to ensure the Amendments were passed. Following the Fair Districts Amendments passing, LWVFL has been involved in several rounds of litigation to enforce the Amendments and ensure the standards laid out in the Constitution were followed by lawmakers.
10. **During Florida’s 2022 and 2026 congressional redistricting processes, League of Women Voters of Florida advocated for fair redistricting that complies with the Fair Districts Amendments. The Challenged Plan nullifies these efforts, and its effect contradicts the LWVFL’s mission and the interests LWVFL works to protect.**

11. I was present for committee meetings and floor votes during the 2026 legislative special session. During committee meetings, I heard Jason Poreda acknowledge that he used partisan data when drawing the map that was passed.
12. As part of my Presidential responsibilities, I work with League of Women Voters of the United States and local leagues in Florida. There is a membership list that all three league levels can access depending on their chapter. As LWVFL president, I have access to the list of all Florida state members, and all members of each of the 29 local chapters across the state. We have thousands of members all over the state—from Pensacola to the Florida Keys.
13. Based on my review of the League of Women Voters of Florida member database, I am personally aware that we have members who are eligible voters living in the following Challenged Plan Districts:
