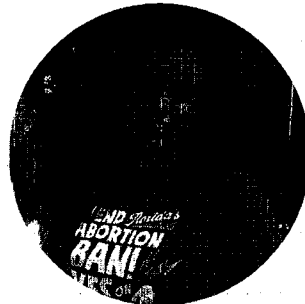

History of the ACLU

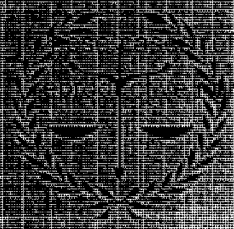
Founded in 1940, the ACLU was founded as a civil liberties and human rights organization, and has since become the nation's leading defender of the rights and liberties guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution. In the early years, the ACLU fought against the widespread suppression of speech during World War I, and later against the persecution of political dissidents and dissenters. The ACLU's mission has expanded over the years to include the protection of a broad range of civil rights, including freedom of speech, privacy, equal protection under the law, and due process. The Supreme Court's ruling that racial segregation in public schools was unconstitutional.

Gideon v. Wainwright (1963): Argued for the right of indigent defendants to have legal counsel, leading to the ruling that states are required to provide attorneys to defendants who cannot afford one.

Loving v. Virginia (1967): Played a role in the case that struck down laws banning interracial marriage, with the Supreme Court ruling that such laws violated the Equal Protection Clause.

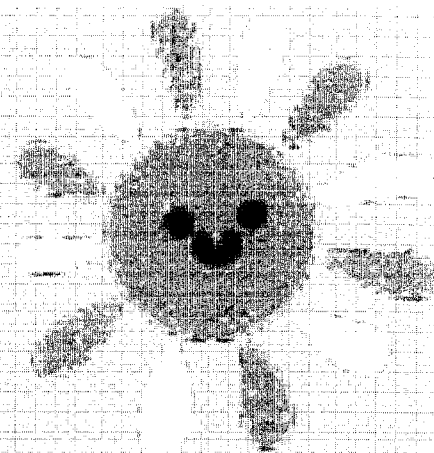
Roe v. Wade (1973) - Justice in the landmark case that recognized a woman's constitutional right to choose to have an abortion

Overdefinitely, Hodges (2013: 5) proposes the case marker to the east and to the south, so that it is possible to access the United States



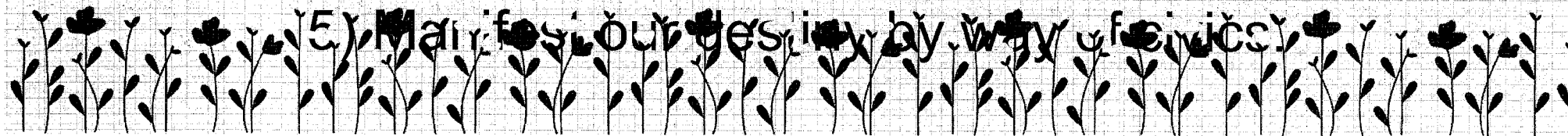

Lawsuit Background

- On May 23, 2024, the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) of Florida, O'Melveny and Myers, and Vasquez Segarra filed a lawsuit on behalf of Cuban@s Miami, Engage Miami, the ACLU Club at FIU, and five individuals, challenging four Congressional Districts and seven State House districts as racially gerrymandered.
- The lawsuit, filed in the U.S. District Court in Miami, claims that the challenged districts illegally draw the challenged seats solely to divvy up Latino voters in a way the Legislature saw

Specifics About Particular Districts

- In the congressional map, lawmakers connected distinct, disparate Latino communities (in Miami-Dade County and Collier County) solely because of race.
- Congressional District 26 stretches across the state from Biscayne Bay to the Gulf, from urban Hialeah and Wynwood with rural farmworker communities in Immokalee, and the Naples suburbs.
 - This district splits communities and lumps two separate parts of the state together, divided by the Everglades.
 - It unnecessarily connects both Collier County and Miami-Dade County.
- Other congressional districts cover the remainder of Miami-Dade County.
- State House districts were drawn to form long, skinny, non-compact shapes north-south.
 - These districts lump different parts of Miami-Dade County together, and separate communities that have a lot in common and should be in the same district.
 - Other State House districts unnecessarily split up the City of Miami into separate pieces and lump distinct communities into the same districts.

Answers to your questions

- If this lawsuit is successful, it'll result in electing more Democrats – isn't this lawsuit purely partisan?

• No, it isn't. It's not partisan at all, rather the opposite. It's about the people of South Florida electing their representatives to the Florida Legislature.

- Latino legislators are against the map – does that mean your case is meritless?

• No, we can't speak to the motivations of any particular lawmaker.

- But Latino voters in South Florida are against the current map because it splits our communities and neighborhoods, and because we deserve a better map than we deserve.

• It's been two years after the map was passed?

- The timing of this lawsuit is not a coincidence. What's concerning is the state's deliberate splitting of the diverse South Florida Latino community.
- Unless someone stands up now, this map will be in place for the entire decade. The time is always right to do what's right.

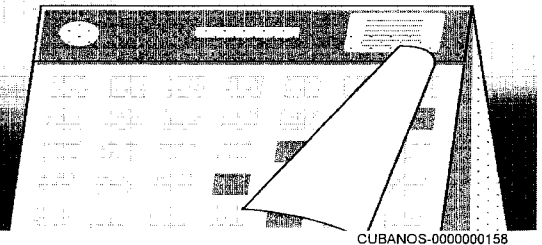
