**DECLARATION OF  
M. CHRISTIAN GREEN  
IN SUPPORT OF  
PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR  
TEMPORARY  
RESTRAINING ORDER AND  
PRELIMINARY  
INJUNCTION**

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, I, M. Christian Green, declare as follows:

1. I am over eighteen years of age and competent to make this declaration.
2. I am a U.S. citizen.
3. I am a U.S. citizen and a resident of the city of Lafayette, in Laying Parish in Louisiana.
4. I am a lawfully registered voter. I reside and am registered to vote in Congressional District ("CD") 3 under my full name of Martha Christian Green.
5. I am currently the President of the League of Women Voters of Louisiana and the League of Women Voters of Louisiana Education Fund, herein after collectively the "LWVLA".
6. I have been President of the LWVLA for three years.
7. These organizations were formed under Section 501(c)(4) and Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, respectively, and are the Louisiana affiliates of the national League of Women Voters.

8. Formed in the 1940s, LWVLA is a volunteer-run non-partisan, non-profit organization that seeks to encourage informed and active participation in government.
9. LWVLA has six local Leagues in Louisiana: LWV of New Orleans, LWV of St. Tammany, LWV of Lafayette, LWV of Caddo-Bossier, LWV of Iberia, and LWV of Tangipahoa. Each local League is a member of LWVLA, and all members of the local Leagues are members of LWVLA. Currently, a seventh LWV of Baton Rouge is in the process of formation as a State Unit under LWVLA auspices, and it may eventually seek status as an independent local League. LWVLA also has members at large, around the state, in places where there is no local League.
10. The LWVLA works to ensure that all eligible individuals have the opportunity and the information needed to register and vote, with a particular focus on members of traditionally underrepresented and underserved communities who benefit the most from additional education and assistance, including voters of color, first-time voters, low-income voters, newly naturalized citizens, young voters, and voters impacted by the criminal legal system, including individuals with felony convictions seeking to register to vote after their rights have been restored.
11. The LWVLA has worked across the state of Louisiana, since July 2025, to educate voters about the changes to the primary system pursuant to La. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 18:410.3(A), which are being implemented for the May 16, 2026 elections.

12. The LWVLA has approximately 236 members.
13. Between the local Leagues and its members at large, LWVLA's membership include individuals across the state of Louisiana who share in its mission to educate and engage eligible voters and encourage all residents to actively participate in Louisiana's political process. These members are also registered voters who vote regularly in all Louisiana elections and have voted or plan to vote in the congressional primary elections this year.
14. Voter education is part of the LWVLA core mission. It is part of the LWVLA core mission to encourage the maximum participation of eligible voters in all Louisiana elections.
15. The LWVLA conducts educational activities around the state, in many communities beyond where its own members live, and engages in many relationships with voters beyond its own members.
16. LWVLA is known in the communities as a trusted resource for voter education and information.
17. LWVLA is responsible for the Louisiana page on VOTE411.org, which is a nonpartisan voter information resource coordinated by LWV. To ensure VOTE411.org is an effective resource for voters in every election, local Leagues help with collecting data on each local, state, and federal race.
18. In line with this mission to educate voters, LWVLA has engaged in voter education efforts around the 2026 primary elections in Louisiana.
19. LWVLA has expended considerable resources educating voters about the new voting process for the primary elections on May 16, 2026. For example, the

LWVLA received a large grant to educate voters about changes in the election process for this year's primary elections. The LWVLA has held voter education events addressing these changes in Marksville, Lake Charles, Ruston, Shreveport and New Orleans. Additionally, some portions of this grant went to all six local Leagues to support their work educating voters about the new primary system.

20. If, pursuant to the Governor's Executive Order issued on April 30, 2026, the closed party congressional primary elections, which are currently ongoing through absentee voting and required by state law to conclude on Election Day, May 16, 2026, are suspended, then the LWVLA will be required to provide significant education to voters about the changes. This Order will cause the LWVLA to divert significant resources away from its core activities, including voter registration, voter education with youth and student voters, and work restoring the voting rights of individuals with felony convictions.
21. If the congressional primary elections are suspended, pursuant to the Governor's Order, the LWVLA will have to divert resources away from its core activities to update VOTE411.org.
22. This last-minute change has caused and will continue to cause significant voter confusion, which impedes and will continue to impede the LWVLA's ability to educate voters and persuade voters to participate in Louisiana elections. This change will impede the LWVLA's ability to carry out its core mission of achieving the maximum participation of eligible voters in Louisiana elections.
23. My understanding is that absentee ballots have already been sent out to many voters in Louisiana.

24. I am personally aware of LWVLA members who have received absentee ballots that included congressional primaries. I am personally aware of LWVLA members who have already returned their absentee ballots. In addition to myself, I am also personally aware of LWVLA members how have already early voted on Saturday, May 3, 2026. These members have voted in the Democratic primary in Congressional Districts 2, 3 and 5. *See* Ex. a, which is attached and contains examples of statements from LWVLA members.
25. Additionally, I aware that LWVLA member, Charla Jo Johnson, voted early in-person in the Republican primary in Congressional District 6 on May 2, 2026.
26. I am also personally aware of voters who regularly partner with and volunteer with the LWV and who have voted in the Democratic primary in Congressional Districts 3 and 4. *See* Ex. b, which is attached and contains examples of statements from LWVLA volunteers.
27. These members have expressed concerns that their votes in congressional races will not be counted due to the Governor's Executive Order suspending the closed party primaries for congressional elections.
28. Early voting in the March primary elections started on Saturday, May 2, 2026. I went and voted in this election. I cast a vote in the closed primary for U.S. House of Representative, Congressional District 3 election.
29. I know from discussions I have had with voters and other LWVLA members that the timing of the Governor and Secretary's actions has caused confusion throughout the State of Louisiana about whether elections are still occurring and what will appear on the ballot.

30. It is my personal belief that suspending the election for a race that is already on the ballot sends a message that my vote is disposable.
31. I am worried and other members of the LWVLA are extremely concerned that our votes will not be counted.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct. This Declaration was executed on May 3, 2026.





