Please see attached proposed order. In the interests of speed, this is not redlined against your old order but is submitted to you "clean."

In order for the Court to enter an order that the Secretary rewrite, we are going to have a record to support the entry of such an order.

After reviewing the Secretary's Answer to Plaintiffs' Petition, we do not have that yet. So this order recites that the Secretary Stipulates to the factual predicates needed for entry of the order.
