DECLARATION OF GLENDORA BROTHERS

I, Glendora Brothers, swear under penalty of perjury that the following information is true to the best of my knowledge and state the following:

1. I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth herein.
2. I have been a resident of Pasquotank County, North Carolina, located in Congressional District 1 (CD1) for my entire life. I am 65 years old and have lived at my current residence for the past 47 years.
3. I am retired but was formerly a registered nurse for 33 years.
4. I have been voting since I was 18 years old and I have never missed an election. Historically, I have supported Democratic candidates, however, for the past 20-30 years I have been registered as an Independent. I have also historically supported Black candidates who align with my interests, as I believe that any Black candidate is just as good as the next White one. We all deserve to be represented.
5. I have been civically engaged in my community since childhood. Before I was old enough to vote, I accompanied my mother to district meetings and went with her to the polls to get familiar with the process. There was never a question of whether my family would be participating in the electoral process; we were going to the polls.
6. Now, I take my children and grandchildren with me to vote. They get involved in working the polls and making “safe sites” for voters—a task that we typically undertake along with members of the local NAACP. I do not know anyone in my family who is not engaged and active in voting and in helping others to vote. We work to make sure others feel safe during the voting process and to ensure that people have transportation and other support needed to get to the polls.

7. I became aware of the legislature's most recent redistricting plans through my involvement with election protection and voter advocacy. I have been aware of the efforts to redistrict eastern North Carolina specifically since 2023, when Common Cause held sessions on the subject.

8. My understanding of what the new redistricting plan entails is that they are watering down the vote and redrawing the lines so that the majority vote trends towards the Republican Party.

9. I have previously spoken out about attempted gerrymandering of CD1 in 2023. I submitted a letter to the North Carolina Court of Appeals and spoke at various events surrounding the redistricting conversation at that time.

10. Here in CD1, Representative Don Davis is more visible than most of the other politicians that serve this area. I may not always agree with his decisions, and he may not always vote the way that people want him to, but he is more accessible and visible than most of the other representatives for this area. When you contact his office, you actually get a response. It makes you feel as if you are actually being considered and heard. In contrast to this, we have a state representative from Elizabeth City, (North Carolina State Representative Bill Ward) that I have never even seen in the community. How can he represent us adequately if he does not engage with the community he represents?

11. I have several military members in my family. My father was a World War II soldier. My brother was in the Air Force for 30 years and was very affected by his time in Vietnam. My other brother served during peace time. My son just retired from the Air Force, having served in Afghanistan and Iraq. It makes me angry to think that though my family members have served this country, when they return home they still have to struggle for their vote to count as much as the

next person, especially after making so many sacrifices on the individual and family level – they literally risked their lives. It’s like they fight while they are away and then have to come back and fight at home.


12. As a result of this new redistricting plan, I am motivated to be even more involved in my community because many people here do not feel like their vote counts. It is important that we find ways to show that their voices do matter and count, on a daily basis and on every level.

13. The events surrounding the latest redistricting plan have negatively affected my opinion of, and trust in, the voting system. They are boldly telling us – in our faces – that they do not care about our vote. They do not care about the wellbeing of Black voters. They do not care that we can see them doing all of this against normal procedures and without the support of the public.

14. The new maps feel like a power grab, especially in the wake of the courts already determining that previous gerrymandering tactics were racially motivated and illegal. Despite that, the people supporting this new plan do not care and are still attempting to do more of the same.

15. If the 2025 maps are not overturned, I believe it will be extremely difficult to make our voices heard on a national level.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of North Carolina that the foregoing is true and correct. Executed on November 14, 2025.
