Sweeney, in his individual capacity and official capacity as a Member of the New Jersey Apportionment Commission; and the Court having entered an order directing Defendants to show cause why a preliminary injunction should not issue; and the Court having afforded numerous Defendants and interested parties an opportunity to be heard; and Plaintiff having filed a reply; and the Court having considered the written and oral

IT IS on this 1st day of February 2022 **ORDERED** that:

- 1. Plaintiff's application for an order granting preliminary injunctive relief vacating the actions of Defendant Leroy Y. Jones, Jr., in removing Plaintiff Steven M. Sweeney as a member of the Commission is **DENIED**.
- 2. Plaintiff's application for an order granting preliminary injunctive relief vacating the actions of Defendant Secretary of State May in certifying Defendant Laura Matos as a member of the Commission is **DENIED**.
- 3. Plaintiff's application for an order granting preliminary relief enjoining the Commission from taking further action until Plaintiff is reinstated as a member of the Commission is **DENIED**.
- 4. Plaintiff's application for an order preliminarily reinstating Plaintiff as a member of the Commission is **DENIED**.
- Defendants' responsive pleadings are due consistent with the Rules of Court.
